Estimated cumulative proportion of OB physicians, nurses, and other providers who have completed an education program on severe hypertension/preeclampsia, severe hypertension in pregnancy bundle elements, and a unit-standard protocol in the past 2 years3. Proportion of patients with persistent severe hypertension who were treated within 1 hour (excluding those with an exacerbation of chronic hypertension)	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Has your hospital developed OB-specific resources and protocols to support patients, families, and staff through major OB complications2. Has your hospital established a system to perform regular formal debriefing discussions after cases with major complications3. Has your hospital established a process to perform multidisciplinary system-level review of all SMM cases4. Does your hospital have an up-to-date severe hypertension/preeclampsia policy or procedure for the unit that provides a standard approach to care (including measuring blood pressure, treating severe hypertension/preeclampsia, administering magnesium sulfate, and treating magnesium sulfate overdose)5.
